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ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM NEWS PJ MATTSON, MMR & DICK GENTHNER, MMR

The tear down of the old Arpee and Western Railroad is not only underway, but is almost complete thanks to my many helpers and volunteers. As I write this in early April all of the bench work has been taken down and parts of the A&W are being dispersed around the area. The Katterskill scene with the Otis cable car has been donated to the Ulster & Delaware Railroad Historical Society museum in the old Roxbury, NY train station. Several of the A&W yards have been donated to the InfoAge museum in Wall Township. NJ for the use of Boy Scouts in the area. The scene with Huey's pond and high steel trestle has been acquired by Ray Notaro for an expansion project on his model railroad. And the whole Ontario & Western terminal will be reconstructed in my grandsons' basement in Mendham, NJ. I'll have a lot of work rebuilding it with them and getting it operational again. Unfortunately the remainder that has not been donated or sold will be carted off to the Monmouth County recycling center for final disposal.

In the mean time I need to talk with you about the N J Division Achievement Program. At the March meet I hinted at a "library" I'd like to start to help the members with the paper work aspects of the various achievement certificates such as locos, cars, structures, scenery, electrical, civil, chief dispatcher, etc. Each of these certificates requires some written material to be submitted describing the modeling work that has been done as part of the "Statement of Qualifications" package. There are similar re-

quirement for written explanations that must be submitted when a model or scene is to be judged. Preparing this written material can be quite daunting and many members who wish to get models judged or who need to submit a completed "SOQ" could use some hints and guidance on how to proceed.

My suggestion is to create an on-line library of such items that could be shared with other members working on the various AP certificates. Maybe we could help out each other by sharing copies of paperwork that has already been submitted as a hint as to what has worked before. For instance, have you written up a car or building model to be judged? Or, have you submitted the paperwork for the Electrical or Scenery certificates? Why not make a copy of your paper work and send it to me for an AP Library of submitted applications? Of course members should not, would not, or even think of submitting someone else's paperwork as their own effort, but they could see what has worked before and use it as a quide for their own submittals.

I have copies of my own paper work for the models I have had judged and for the certificates that I hold. I often share these with members who are working on similar certificates. I also have some copies of the paperwork done by other members. Why not send me copies by email of your written material? I'll find a way to store them until someone needs a copy as a resource for their modeling

work. If we do this on line it could be quite efficient and quick. All I need is for all of you to send me your completed examples to share with others.

I'd appreciate your thoughts on this idea. I'm certain other members working in the AP would greatly benefit in seeing how someone else did what they still have to do. You can send me your copies at the email address below. I'll let you know in the fall how many copies we have in this new library.

MODULAR MODELING IN THE NEW JERSEY DIVISION

Here's the latest happenings with modular railroading in the NJ Division...

If you were at the March Meet you had a chance to see Mike Prokop's first module. Mike has plans for a 3 section module in a T shape. The one module Mike brought was the mainline section. In Free-mo, a centered single track mainline that exits on a 24" end is the required interface to mate with other modules. Mike's other two modules will features curving track that leaves the mainline to serve industries and also a car ferry at the end. The prototype Mike has chosen is the rail lines in Camden, NJ and the car float that operated at the base of the Ben Franklin bridge, near today's Riversharks baseball stadium. The great thing about Free-mo is that it allows this type of module to be included with no special considerations other than having the space to put it into the overall layout.

Mike showcased his great carpentry skills. The module was strong yet lightweight, and featured integrated fold down legs. I can see why Mike was commissioned by a couple of other folks to help get their modules started. And now that I have taken my modules to more than a dozen events, fold down legs would be a real nice feature. If you are planning on building a module, check out what Mike has done.

The track included flex along with handlaid Fast Track turnouts, which is fully allowed in the Free-mo standard. Mike also used some interesting turnout controls, servo motors and frog juicers from Tam Valley Depot. All in all Mike's modules are off to a great start and I look forward to seeing his progress. Check out some of the photos at the web site njfreemo.org.

By the way, in addition to this NJ Free-mo web site, there is also a blog that allows participants in NJ Free-mo to post with the latest happenings on their modules, their plans, prototype photos, build ideas, etc. Check it out at njfreemo.blogspot.com. Division members Mike Prokop and Geert Marien were just added to the contributors so I expect we'll see some more info on their modules soon.

I mentioned that I have now taken my modules to over a dozen events in a little over 2 years. The next year or so is also shaping up to have lots of Free-mo activities to choose from. In addition to the Timonium shows with Capitol Free-mo, there are plans in the works for other Free-mo set ups including a prototype modeler Meet, a regional convention, a possible town railroad celebration day and more. Keep an eye on the NJ free-mo web sites mentioned above for the latest information.

I received some news from Carl Haslett of the NJ Southern N-trak club. They are actively participating again in the National Train Day activities. This is the 5th year for this event and NJ Southern will have modules at both 30th Street Station in Philadelphia and Grand Central Terminal in New York City. Wow, quite a bit of co-

ordination needed for that. Check out the web site nationaltrainday.com for the latest info as it becomes available.





Since I have gained so much from the organization with friendship and guidance, when the opportunity came to me to offer my services providing coffee and refreshments, I had to volunteer. It is a way for me to give a little help back to an organization whose leadership has given so much of their time and talent, and the membership who have shared their knowledge with clinics, open houses and presentation of railroad movies and how-to slide shows at meets."

Meet Bill Grosse, Jr., Newly Appointed Member Contact Representative





- A. <u>From New York City & Northern New Jersey</u>: Garden State Parkway south to Exit 138. Make left onto Boulevard (in Kenilworth). Go 3 traffic lights. Just after the 3rd traffic light, make right onto N. 14th Street (around Harding School). Go through 1 traffic light and continue approximately 3/4 mile on Springfield Road. The Wal-Mart/Home Depot shopping center entrance will be on your left. Enter the parking lot and go past Wal-Mart and The Home Depot. Turn left and go the end of the road (the police shooting range will be right in front of you). Follow the signs to the Club. The Club building is directly behind The Home Depot.
- B. *From South Jersey*: Parkway North to Exit 138; left onto Galloping Hill Road. At 1st traffic light the road becomes "Boulevard." Follow directions for A, above.
- C. <u>*Rt. 22 Eastbound*</u>: Turn right onto Jefferson Avenue, about 1/2 mile past Target. Follow signs directing you to Club building (behind The Home Depot).

NMRA APRIL INFONET NEWS

- Fundraising has begun for the "Magic of Scale Model Railroading" gallery at the California State Railroad Museum in Sacramento, CA. As your members will probably recall, this gallery will introduce the Museum's 600,000 annual visitors to the hobby, as well as give them a sense of its history. One of the highlights of the gallery will be actual portions of the finest model railroads ever built. The Museum has donated the space rent-free to the NMRA for the purpose of promoting the hobby. It's estimated that the cost to build the exhibit will be approximately \$750,000, and no NMRA dues or monies will be used; instead, it will be entirely funded by donations. To date, over \$100,000 has been raised, and an anonymous donor has agreed to match donations, up to \$250,000.Any NMRA member (or non-member, for that matter) who would like to donate to the funding of the gallery should send his or her tax-deductable donation to NMRA Headquarters at 4121 Cromwell Road., Chattanooga, TN 37421-2119, and mark it "Gallery donation."
- In the February edition of the InfoNet News we reported the agreement of cooperation between the NMRA and the Hasea.com Model Railroad Association of China. This July we'll be seeing the first fruits of that "Hands Across The Ocean" agreement as a group of teenage Chinese modelers and railfans visits California with the purpose of seeing layouts, prototype trains, and the California State Railway Museum. Several Pacific Coast Region members are helping to organize this 2-week event.
- Grand Rails 2012, the upcoming NMRA national convention, has announced their commemorative convention car. Grand Rapids, Michigan, was once known as The Furniture Capital of the World, and appropriately the model was inspired by a postcard photograph of a turn-ofthe-last-century furniture manufacturer's wood-sided boxcar. This replica, produced by Accurail, comes complete with a Grand Rails 2012 logo "poster" which can be applied by the modeler. Visit www.gr2012.org to see a shot of the prototype.
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- The folks at Grand Rails 2012 have posted a preliminary clinic schedule for the convention in PDF format, downloadable at their website. Among the clinicians are NMRA Worldwide Director Tony Koester, Jim Six, Jim Sacco, and a group of clinics by the Layout Design Sig.


