It has a while since we visited Deptford Township for a division meet. Thanks to member Steve Moylan, we will meet at the **Deptford Township** Community Center at 1219 Delsea Drive [*NJ Rt 47] in Deptford. New Jersev. It is about one mile north of the Deptford Township Office Building where we met last, a few years ago. The township purchased a former Catholic Church property that includes the church and a school building. The church building now serves as a community theater and the school building now hosts athletics and large meetings in the gym and classrooms for smaller meetings and events. September Meet

The meet at the Cumberland County Community Church went well. The facility was already set up with seating plus plenty of tables for displays and other purposes. The contact person made herself available all morning. We had no issues or problems.

Our clinician, Thom Radice, gave an excellent presentation about the steel plant in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1855. He described the historical context of the plant's processes and production. With the use of drawings and photographs, we learned about the special processing of rail and other steel products that served important functions, especially during the following civil war. The plant was completely destroyed during the later years of the war.

Thom did significant research on the plant and its processes to build an HO model for his Civil War layout. Using multiple sources plus the photos of the destroyed plant, he determined the locations and configuration of the internal systems of the plant. With a series of slides, Thom described the materials and procedures he used to scratch build the plant model. His tenacity, attention to detail, problem solving skills, and extensive research resulted in an exceptional model I personally observed on his layout.

I conducted the required annual business meeting including the election report. Joe Zebrowski was reelected to the office of Clerk/Secretary. Jack Menaker and Geert Marien were also reelected to continue as Board Directors. Thom Radice was elected to the Board to replace Rick Stoneking. Rick was elected to the Secretary office of the Mid -Eastern Region and continues as the Region's Publicist. We give Rick thanks for his very important service this past year as Director with responsibilities in technology. He took charge and made our meets available to members who could not attend via Zoom broadcasts including video of selected clinics. We wish him well in his new responsibilities. Congratulations to all.

You get a certificate and a \$10.00 certificate to pay for the annual participation fee.



Current HO Scale Car Projects

N&W HC-46 ACF 2-Bay Covered Hopper New! Arrived Sept. 2022



Using Accurail's 2200 Series ACF 2-Bay Covered Hopper as the basis, we are offering it in a Norfolk & Western repaint scheme. These cars are N&W class HC-46 and are from an original batch of fifty built by in 1966 by ACF with the Round Herald paint scheme. Subsequently some cars went through a general maintenance program and were repainted in the block N&W livery. Photos were found showing at least three of these cars (road numbers 170753, 170768 and 170794) were reweighed at some later date because that area is "patched out" on the car with the new data displayed. Those same photos place these three cars as being in service in 1992 and 2004. It is these three, highly unique, road numbers that Cincinnati Division 7 is now offering for sale as limited edition kits.

Pricing is \$25 per car, or a 3-car set at \$70. Shipping (via USPS Priority) is \$9.45 for one car and \$17.10 for two to three cars. Ohio residents, please add 7.8% sales tax on the total price of the kits and the shipping/handling fee. Customers outside the USA, please <u>contact us</u> for shipping arrangements and charges.

The November Clinics Provide Something for Everyone John V. Gallagher Director of Clinics

My day is made when volunteers tell me that they are ready to present a clinic. Two clinicians recently came forward last month to do just that. These topics should interest most model railroaders.

Glyn Thomas sent this description: Model Railroad Photography for Publication by Glyn Thomas, MMR

Publishing photos of your models is a good way of gaining recognition within the hobby and among your peers; it may also help to offset some modeling costs. Good photographs dramatically increase the likelihood of getting published. You don't need to be an equipment geek and computer expert to produce good photos (but it helps!). This clinic discusses ways of improving model railroad photography and is illustrated with several projects I've executed.

If you have been an NMRA member for the past two years, you observed some of his photos. His SEPTA Philadelphia street scene shows exceptional modeling, creativity, and attention to detail with the waiting commuters wearing masks and practicing social distancing during the COVID epidemic. It is found in the January page of the NMRA 2021 Calendar.

Not to rest on his laurels, Glyn returned in the NMRA 2022 Calendar with a coal mine scene for the month of April. Incidentally, the New Jersey one did well in this year's calendar. Look at the photo for the month of July to see member Jim Albanowski's great photo of the Pacific Southern Railway layout in Rocky Hill, New Jersey. The calendar had an error for the location's state. We are not done! The September photo shows the modeling skills of Marc Pitanza of Red Bank. The Staten Island Rapid Transit was a subsidiary of the B&O railroad that used third rail rapid transit cars on a Private Right of Way. The transit cars closely followed the design and size of the BMT transit cars of the other boroughs of New York City. The B&O served freight customers on the island.

Dave Albertson will present a **Brief History of Model Railroading: Cars, Locomotives, Track and Power Systems.**

He did considerable research to assemble a PowerPoint presentation of the major persons, companies, products and accomplishments. I learned many facts and connections that never knew before reviewing his presentation,

Dave plans bringing a few historical model artifacts to the meet to display and help members relate to their historical significance. I will bring a few items from my collection. Do YOU have model railroad historical items of rolling stock, rail, or power systems that will relate to the history from the 1890's through 1980? If you want to bring a *few*, to the meet to display during the break, contact me so I can reserve some table space. Table space will be limited so we are not looking for a complete Lionel train set including the box, etc. <u>FEW!</u> Please. I will give you some instructions on your display to include information cards. So, out of your treasure troves, bring that Ives locomotive or that Lionel 700EW NYC Hudson locomotive or... The interactions will make for a learning experience for all and lots of sharing knowledge. Remember, please contact me by **Wednesday, November 16** to reserve your space. Thanks!

Finally, I will pass the clipboard for you to volunteer to offer a future clinic at a NJD meet. I need a clinician for our joint meet with the Philadelphia Division on January 14, 2023 in Merchantville. We will do the Works in Progress meet in Switlik Park in March and I need 10 clinicians for the short 30-minute clinics. It is up close and informal and fun to do. Step up and show us some technique[s] you do in modeling. Please contact me if you need information or help. Finally, I need one clinician for the May joint meet in north Jersey with the Garden State Division. Date and location are to be determined by the GSD.

A review of the cars. They are \$35 each, or a set of two for \$65. Car numbers are 1968 and 2018, which was the year that the New Jersey Division was founded and the year we celebrated our 50th anniversary. The model is from Tangent Models and is a superb model of a 52'6" Riveted Drop End Gondola with 70 ton trucks. The placement of the brake wheel on the side is an identifying feature of a drop end Gondola. They're ready to run and come with Kadee couplers.


We acquired equal amounts of the two car numbers. Cash or check will consummate the deal and you'll be hauling stuff around your layout in no time!

These are excellent looking and beautifully running cars, but, a car not decorated for a prototypical railroad, they do have the look of a gondola that you might see in any train consist from the 1930's to the 1980's.
